loyalty.

In the case of Samuel Downs, John
W Downs and Frank W Downs —
arrested and detained near Fort Henry
on the charge of disloyalty, aiding
and abetting the Rebellion one Thomas
Futrel deposes and says as follows

That the above named persons
have repeatedly and publicly expressed
their disunion sentiments, have driven
Union men from their homes by threats
of hanging them in case they remained
that they said that no one but rascals
would take any provisions to the Federal
troops, also that the Confederate forces
would soon have possession of this
country, and then they would arrest
every Union man in this part of the country,
also that the loyal citizens stand in great
fear of them
