Died on Thursday the 14th
August 1838, at 7 o'clock
P.M. at Saltville Va.

Christina Stewart Ramage
born Dec. 13, 1846

Tennessee.

Henry L. B. Ramage volunteered
during the late Civil War. he was an
honored member of Company C. 100th Regt.
guards 1st Tennessee Regiment, highly
beloved by his comrades, fell at Kenesaw
near Brownstown, near Marietta, Georgia.
while in advance of his regiment and
in the act of mounting the enemy's
breastworks, on the evening of the
23rd June 1864, in the twilight, aged
24 years. his body was recovered by
his comrades. he was a gallant soldier
and ever ready to do his duty.

31, 1894, at her home, in the midst of her

She was the daughter of Theo. Claiborne,
representative of this district in 1819. She
married to John Ramage at Saltville, Va.,
28, 1836. For forty-six years their life was

made her a character powerful for good.

acter to the end, yet she maintained in her
character a standard of excellence worthy of
emulation. Every word was true—every

Ramage, Esq., of this city, died yester-
day at her residence at half-past 1 o'clock.

ughter of the late Theo. Claiborne, who re-
sented this district in congress in 1819.
Two brothers survive her viz: Ben
Claiborne and Col. Theo. Claiborne.
