CHAP. I.

1 *Jerius his charge to the priests and Levites.* 7 A great passover is kept. 33 His death is much lamented. 34 His successors. 53 The temple, city, and many people are destroyed. 56 The rest are carried into Babylon.

2 And Josias held the ^afeast of the passover in Jerusalem unto his Lord, and offered the passover ^bthe fourteenth day of the first month;

3 Having set the priests according to their daily courses, being arrayed in long garments, in the temple of the Lord.

4 And he spake unto the Levites, the holy ministers of Israel, that they should hallow themselves unto the Lord, to set the holy ark of the Lord in the house that king Solomon the son of David had built:

5 According as David the king of Israel prescribed, and according to the magnificence of Solomon his son: and standing in the temple according to the several dignity of the families of you the Levites, who minister in the presence of your brethren the children of Israel,

6 Offer the passover in order, and make ready the sacrifices for your brethren, and keep the passover according to the commandment of the Lord which was given unto Moses.

7 And unto the people that was found there, Josias gave thirty thousand lambs and kids, and three thousand calves; these things were given of the king's allowance, according as he promised to the people, to the priests, and to the Levites.

8 And Helkias, Zacharias, and Syclus, the governors of the temple, gave to the priests for the passover two thousand and six hundred sheep, and three hundred calves.

9 And Jeconias, and Sannias, and Nathaniel his brother, and Assabias, and Ochiel, and Joram, captains over thousands, gave to the Levites for the passover five thousand sheep, and seven hundred calves.

10 And when these things were done, the priests and Levites having the unleavened bread, stood in very comely order according to the kindreds,

11 And according to the several dignities of the fathers, before the people, to offer to the Lord, as it is written in the book of Moses: and thus did they in the morning.

12 And they roasted the passover with fire as appertaineth: as for the sacrifices, they set them in brass pots, and pans, & with a good savour.

13 And set them before all the people: and afterwards they prepared for themselves, and for the priests their brethren, the sons of Aaron.

14 For the priests offered the fat until night: and the Levites prepared for themselves, and for the priests their brethren, the sons of Aaron.

15 The holy singers also, the sons of Asaph, were in their order, according to the appointment ^aof David, to wit, Asaph, Zacharias, and Jeduthun; who was ^bof the king's retinue.

16 Moreover, the porters were at every gate: it was not lawful for any to go from his ordinary service: for their brethren the Levites prepared for them.

17 Thus were the things that belonged to the sacrifices of the Lord accomplished in that day, that they might hold the passover.

18 And offer sacrifices upon the altar of the Lord, according to the commandment of king Josias.

19 So the children of Israel which were present ^aheld the passover at that time, and the feast of sweet bread seven days.

20 And such a passover was not kept in Israel since the time of the prophet Samuel.

21 Yea, all the kings of Israel held not such a passover as Josias, and the priests, and the Levites, and the Jews, held with all Israel that were found dwelling at Jerusalem.

22 In the eighteenth year of the reign of Josias was this passover kept.

23 And the works of Josias were upright before his Lord, with an heart full of godliness.

24 As for the things that came to pass in his time, they were written in former times, concerning those that sinned, and ^bdid wickedly against the Lord above all people and kingdoms, and how they grieved him ^cexceedingly, so that the words of the Lord rose up against Israel.

25 Now after all these acts of Josias, it came to pass, that Pharaoh the king of Egypt came to raise war at Carchemis upon Euphrates: and Josias went out against him.

26 But the king of Egypt sent to him, saying, What have I to do with thee, O king of Judah?

27 I am not sent out from the Lord against thee; for my war is upon Euphrates: and now the Lord is with me, ^dyea, the Lord is with me, hastening my day, and depart from me, and be not against the Lord.

28 Howbeit Josias did not turn back his chariot from him, but undertook to fight with him,

the day of the ungodly, & the day of the infidelity of the people.

MALACHI.
14 And I will bring me with the Lord of hosts,
and he will come in his chariot, & he will change not; therefore ye nations, & all lands are not consumed.

15 For I am from the days of your fathers ye a nation & a race from mine ordinances, and have not kept them. To turn unto me, and I will return unto you, saith the Lord of hosts. But wherefore do ye still say, we shall we return?

16 For I am your God: Yet ye have robbed me. But ye say, Wherein have we robbed thee? In tithes, & offerings.

17 Ye are cursed with a curse: for ye have robbed me, even the whole nation.

18 For in all the rich lands is the storehouse, that degenerates by meat in mine house, and prove me now herewith, saith the Lord of hosts, if I will not open you the windows of heaven, and pour you out a blessing, that there shall not be room enough to receive it.

19 And I will rebuke the devourer for your sakes, and he shall not destroy the fruits of your ground: neither shall your vine cast her fruit before the time in the field, saith the Lord of hosts.

20 And all nations shall call you blessed: for ye shall be a delightsome land, saith the Lord of hosts.

21 ¶ Your words have been stout against me, saith the Lord. Yet ye say, What have we spoken so much against thee?

22 Ye have said, It is vain to serve God: and what profit is it that we have kept his ordinances, and that we have walked mournfully before the Lord of hosts?

23 And now we call the proud happy; yea, they that work wickedness are set up; yea, they that tempt God are even delivered.

24 ¶ Then they that feared the Lord spoke often one to another: and the Lord hearkened, and heard it, and a book of re-

membrance was written before him for them that feared the Lord, and that thought upon his name.

25 And they shall be mine, with the Lord of hosts, in that day when I make up my jewels; and I will spare them, as a man spareth his own son that serveth him.

26 Then shall ye return, and discern betwix the righteous and the wicked, between him that serveth God and him that serveth him not.

CHAP. IV.

1 God's judgment on the wicked, 2 and his blessing on the good. 4 He exhorteth to the study of the law, 5 and telleth of Elijah's coming and office.

2 ¶ OR, behold, the day cometh, that shall burn as an oven; and all the proud, yea, and all that do wickedly, shall be stubble: and the day that cometh shall burn them up, saith the Lord of hosts, that it shall leave them neither root nor branch.

3 ¶ But unto you that fear my name shall the Sun of righteousness arise with healing in his wings; and ye shall go forth, and grow up as calves of the stall.

4 ¶ And ye shall tread down the wicked: for they shall be ashes under the soles of your feet in the day that I shall do this, saith the Lord of hosts.

5 ¶ Remember ye the law of Moses my servant, which I commanded unto him in Horeb for all Israel, with the statutes and judgments.

6 ¶ Behold, I will send you Elijah the prophet before the coming of the great and dreadful day of the Lord:

7 And he shall turn the heart of the fathers to the children, and the heart of the children to their fathers, lest I come and smite the earth with a curse.

A HISTORY OF OFFICES AND CONDITIONS OF MEN.

Brother of the Family, such as only ; of these were three such as the Sons of Kohath, Levi, and Judah, and his son.

Judah, a journey Superior Governor, immediately appointed by God over the children of Israel.

King, either of the whole nation, or, after the falling off of the ten tribes, of Judah or Israel.

Kibers, Senators, the LXX, or Sanhedrim.

Officers, Provosts, Sheriffs, or Executioners.

Potter, King for Rulers, such as determined controversies in particular cities.

Ierarch, Hebrews, descendants from Jacob.

An Hebrew of Hebrews, an Israelite by original extraction.

A Proselyte of the Covenant, who was circumcised, and submitted to the whole law.

A Proselyte of the Gate, or Stranger, who worshipped one God, but remained uncircumcised.

Officers under the Assyrian or Persian Monarchs.

Tirothata, or Governor, appointed by the kings of Assyria or Persia.

Florid of the Captivity, the chief of each tribe or family, who exercised a precarious government during the captivity.

Under the Grecian Monarchs.

Superior Officers.

Maccabees, the Successors of Judas Maccabæus, high priests, who presided with kingly power.

Under the Roman Emperors.

President, or Governors, sent from Rome with imperial power.

Tetrarchs, who had kingly power in four provinces.

Principals, or Deputies of Provinces.

Inferior Officers.

Publicans, or Tax-gatherers.

Centurions, Captains of an hundred men.

Ecclesiastical Officers, or Seers of Men.

High Priest, who only might enter the Holy of Holies.

Second Priest, or Sagan, who supplied the high priest's Office, in case he were disabled.

High Priests for the War, set apart for the occasion of an expedition.

Priests, Levites of the Sons of Aaron, divided into twenty-four ranks, each rank serving weekly in the temple.

Levites, of the tribe of Levi, but not of Aaron's fa-

mily; Kibters, several sons of Kohath, Levi, and Judah, their inferior servants, or the Servants and Servives (sons of their tribe) to draw water and cleave wood, &c.

Prophets, anciently called Prophets, who foretold future events, and denounced God's judgments.

Children of the Prophets, the immediate disciples.

His men, called so in imitation of the prophets, dog, or Canaan Philosophers.

Smiles, Writers and Expounders of the law.

Disturbers, that raised and determined questions out of the law.

Rabbies, or Doctors, Teachers of Israel.

Libertines, Freed Men of Rome, who, being Jews, or Proselytes, had a synagogue or oratory for themselves.

Gaudonites, or Galilites, who pretended it unlawful to obey an Heathen magistrate.

Heraclians, who shaped their religion to the times, and particularly flattered Herakl.

Epicureans, who placed all happiness in pleasure.

Stoicks, who denied the liberty of the will, and pretended all events were determined by fatal necessity.

Simon Magus, author of the heresy of the Gnosticks, who taught that men, however vicious their practice was, should be saved by their knowledge.

Nicolaianes, the disciples of Nicolas, one of the first seven Deacons, who taught the community of wives.

Mazurites, who under a vow abstained from wine, &c.

Mazarenes, Jews professing Christianity.

Zelots, Sicarii, or Murderers, who, under pretence of the law, thought themselves authorized to commit any outrage.

Pharisees, Separatists, who, upon the opinion of their own godliness, despised all others.

Sadducees, who denied the resurrection of the dead, angels, and spirits.

Sumaritans, mongrel professors, partly Heathen, and partly Jews, the offspring of the Assyrians sent to Samaria.

Apostles, Missionaries, or persons sent; those who were sent by our Saviour, from their number were called, The Twelve.

Bishops, Successors of the Apostles in the government of the church.

Deacons, Officers chosen by the Apostles to take care of the poor.
