Death of N. H. Blizard

The many friends of the family in Athens and vicinity will be pained to hear of the death of Mr. Nathaniel H. Blizard, which occurred Sunday, September 17, 1911, at a sanatorium in Asheville, N. C., whither he had gone a few days previously from his home in Waco, Texas, for treatment in the last stages of tuberculosis.

Mr. Blizard was the youngest son of the late Col. A. Blizard and wife, and was a brother of Frank Blizard and Mrs. Chas. F. (Nellie) Keith, of this city, and a half brother of Capt. Lon Blizard, now in the state of Washington, William Blizard of Meigs county, Tenn., and of Mrs. J. F. Campbell, of Charleston, Tenn. He was born near Athens, August 28, 1863, and was therefore 48 years and 19 days old.

Mr. Blizard was married about 25 years ago to Miss Julia Halsey, of Huntsville, Ala., who survived him together with five children. He was raised in Athens and for a number of years was engaged in merchandising in this city, and later was a successful and popular traveling salesman. The family moved to Texas some years ago where they have since resided.

Mr. Blizard passed through Athens a few weeks ago en route to Asheville, and stopped to pay a final visit to his devoted mother, Mrs. A. Blizard now 82 years of age, and his other relatives here, to all of whom he expressed preparation for death and a complete resignation to his approaching dissolution, though, like all consumptives he retained a lingering hope of recovery. Mr. Frank Blizard accompanied his brother's remains to Waco, Texas, for interment.

DEATH OF FRANK BLIZARD.

The death on May 24, 1911, at his home in this city of Mr. Frank Lea Blizard brought profound sorrow to a wide circle of relatives no less than to many friends.

Frank Lea Blizard was the son of the late A. Blizard and his second wife, formerly Miss Jane Hayes of Bradley county, and he was born in Athens July 18, 1858, being at the time of his death 55 years, 10 months and six days old.

Mr. Blizard was married Nov. 18, 1890, Live Oak, Fla., to Miss Laura White, who, with his aged mother, now in the 85th year of her age, are the only members of his immediate family who survive.

The funeral on the 25th inst., at the family residence was conducted by Dr. J. L. Bachman of Sweetwater, attended by a large concourse of friends, including many from abroad, and the services were characterized by a beautiful and appropriate tribute to the character and manly bearing of the deceased. The display of flowers attested the affection of many friends.

Mr. Blizard had for many years past been connected with the Athens Woolen Mill as secretary and treasurer, but for the last 3 years he has been the traveling representative of the Atlanta Woolen Mill of which Mr. W. N. Nixon is the head, including a mill at Charlotte, N. C.

Returning home about the first of May, Mr. Blizard was prostrated with croupus pneumonia followed by lagrippe from which he died.

Aside from his aged mother and wife of his immediate family, he leaves in this city a sister, Mrs. Nellie Keith, wife of Chas. F. Keith, a half brother, Capt. Lon Blizard in Oregon, a half sister, Mrs. J. C. Campbell of Charleston, and a half brother, William Blizard in Meigs county.

The deceased was a member of the Masonic order, the Royal Arcanum, Elks and Woodmen of the World, and no truer friend, no more patriotic citizen, or devoted husband, and son ever lived than Frank Lea Blizard. His death will be mourned by a wide circle who will always treasure his memory with devoted affection.
