And hearken thou to the supplication of thy servant, and of thy people, when they shall pray toward this place: and hear thou in heaven thy dwelling place: and when thou shalt forgive.

For if any man trespass against his neighbor, and an oath be laid upon him, to cause him to swear, and he shall come before thine altar in sacrifice:

Then hear thou in heaven, and do, O Lord, judge thy servants, and condemn the wicked, to bring his way upon his head; and justifying the righteous, to give him according to his righteousness.

When thy people Israel be smitten down before the enemy, because they have sinned against thee, and they shall turn again to thee, and confess their iniquity, and pray, and make supplication unto thee in this house:

Then hear thou in heaven, and forgive the sin of thy people Israel, and bring them again unto the land which thou swarest unto their fathers.

When heaven is shut up, and there shall be no rain, because they have sinned against thee; if they pray toward this place, and confess thy name, and shall turn from their sin, when thou afflict them:

Then hear thou in heaven, and forgive the sin of thy servants, and of thy people Israel, that thou shalt teach them the good way wherein they shall walk, and give rain upon the land which thou hast given to thy people for an inheritance.
