the opening of the Old Testament is the first announcement of the Redeemer. For the centuries his person and work were set forth. And now the last word of the Old Testament is a description of the one who will yet tarry for four hundred years. The Old Testament is Christo-centric.

MATTHEW.
 We have Four Gospels and not simply one. It is evident from the design of each that they were written for different purposes and hence their characteristics are entirely different. Matthew's Gospel would not meet the needs of the Gospel of the other Gospels, just as the other Gospels would not meet the needs of the Gospel of Matthew. For this reason, while there is a certain value in a Harmony of the Gospels, it is more important that they be studied from the standpoint of their individual characteristics. The same thing reported by the four Gospels might have a different application in each case according to the character and design of each.

According to Mark, Matthew was the son of Alphaeus (Mk. ii. 14). He was a collector of taxes under the Roman government and it was he who held his appointment at Capernaum. He was one of the apostles. His work brought him close dealings with men and he would naturally be easily duped.

Matthew speaks of a work written by Matthew in Aramaic, which would be meant Aramaic, in the form of sayings of our Lord. Jerome thought that the Hebrew Gospel of Matthew was preserved in the library at Caesarea. By internal and external proofs the genuineness of Matthew's Gospel is well established, as any work of classical antiquity. It is used among Christians at an early day, and at the end of the first century the apostolic church accepted it as having canonical authority.

According to the early Fathers it was written for Jewish readers. None of the other Gospels quotes so largely from the Old Testament. Jewish rites and expressions are not used by Matthew as is done by Mark and Luke. It is evident from the book itself that it was written for the Jews. Setting forth the promised Messiah of the Old Testament, the Sermon on the Mount shows the one to which he stood to that covenant. His life, as reported by Matthew, gives a sense of arrangement and unity that is distinctive place among all the other Gospels.

According to the Jew with a view to establishing Messianic claims of Jesus we can see why he should give the royal and priestly descent of our Lord by tracing his lineage to David and Abraham, while Luke, whose genealogy was entirely different, traced it to Adam.

According to the date of Matthew's Gospel, Origen placed it before the others. Jerome likewise, but assigns a much later date. DeWette admits that it was written before the destruction of Jerusalem (A. D. 70) and is probably written about A. D. 60.

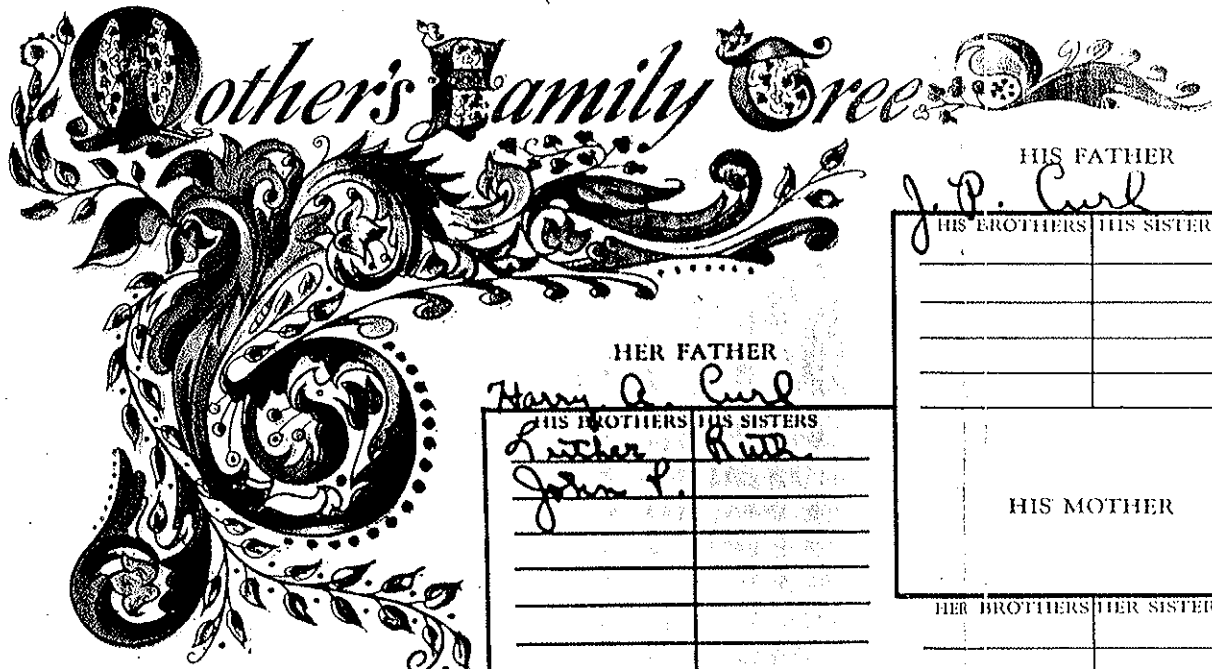
