Mrs. Jane Scott was born in South Carolina Dec 21, 1812, and died May 9, 1893. She united with the M. Deburch at about fourteen years of age, but six or eight years later, learning the way of the Lord more perfectly, she united with the Church of Christ, of which she lived a faithful member for more than half accentury. She was twice married: First, to Brother John Broom, who was an elder of the Clear Creek congregation, McNairy county, Tenn., when he died—a grand, good man, who went to his reward many years ago. Second, to Brother James Scott, Adamsville, Tenn., who is left to mourn his loss. His form is bending toward the tomb with the weight of more than eighty years.
