WATCH	(1) Lam. ii. 19; (2) Judg. vii. 19; (3) Ex. xiv. 24; (4) Matt. xiv. 25	"Before the Captivity the night was divided into three parts or watches; the <i>first</i> watch occurs in (1); the <i>middle</i> watch (2); and the <i>morning</i> watch (3). These probably varied in length according to the time of year. In (4) a <i>fourth</i> watch is mentioned, having been introduced among the Jews by the Romans." (Eastwood and Wright.)
