Mr. and Mrs. J. B. McNeely of Farmington, Ky., recently celebrated their golden-wedding anniversary. The groom of 62 years was born in 1834 and will be 82 years old on March 17. The faithful bride of half a century was born in 1834 and is 68 years old. To this union there were born 11 children, 8 of whom are living, and there are 26 grandchildren and two great-grandchildren. Mr. McNeely boasts he can distinctly remember events that transpired when he was only three years old. He is yet a hardy and active man and can make and keep his fires, keep his stock, catch a team and turn up and gather 12 barrels of corn in

a day. The couple are of Primitive Baptist faith, and until a few years ago boasted that in 40 years they had not missed a monthly meeting at their meeting house. In the early days Mr. McNeely took his family to church in a wooden-wheel truck wagon. Mr. McNeely is a Democrat and was a Rebel soldier, serving four years in the war between the states, and in the last two days of the war had two horses shot from under him. Mr. McNeely says that he is proud of his name, for he never knew one of his name in his long life who was ever incarcerated in a state or federal prison for any length of time.
