The Rev. William L. Rosser died at his home at Madison, Tenn., on the 30th day of August, 1893.

He had been complaining for several days, but there was no apprehension of danger until the day before his death, when he sank very rapidly, and passed away in a few hours.

Mr. Rosser was born in Nashville, Tenn., November 29, 1836. He was, therefore, in his sixty-third year. He made profession of his faith in Christ when he was sixteen years old. His mother was noted among the Presbyterians of the city for her active piety and charity. She brought up her son in the nurture and admonition of the Lord. From a child he knew the Scriptures, and manifested the spirit of Christ. He graduated at the University of Nashville in 1854, and was engaged in business in Memphis, Tenn., for a year or two.

Being impressed with the feeling that he was called of God to preach the Gospel, he entered Princeton Theological Seminary in 1856, and graduated there in 1859. He united with the Presbytery of Nashville in the same year and took charge of the Mount Vernon church.

In 1861, he felt it to be his duty to serve his State as a soldier. He enlisted as a private in the cavalry service. He was captured, and taken to Camp Chase. After a few weeks he was exchanged, and was thereafter with the Seventh Tennessee cavalry; he was adjutant of his regiment, and also he was chaplain—a faithful, brave soldier, and a consistent, active Christian.

After the war he served the church at Franklin, Tenn., for four years. With the exception of two or three years when he was pastor at Coppersville and Lewisburg, Tenn., all his work was done in the Presbytery of Nashville. His connection with that Presbytery covered about thirty-seven years, serving various churches faithfully and well.

Mr. Rosser was twice married. His first wife was a daughter of Col. John R. McEwen, of Franklin, Tenn. She died after a brief married life, leaving one daughter. His second wife was Miss Ruth Jones, a sister of Mr. Edgar Jones, the well-known banker of Nashville. She, with three daughters, survives him.

The life and ministry of Mr. Rosser were a blessing of God upon faithfulness in his service.

His home life was singularly happy. He was a devoted husband and father, a thoroughly manly man, who provided for his household, and on whom they could rely with confidence for care and protection. His great desire and effort was to order his house in the fear of the Lord.

As a minister of the Gospel, Mr. Rosser was a quiet, unostentatious worker. He sought to know only Christ and him crucified. His preaching was plain, simple,

The Rev. William Moffatt Grier, D. D., for twenty-eight years president of Erskine College and for eighteen years editor of the *Associate Reformed Presbyterian*, died of apoplexy at Dae West, S. C., September 3. He was specially beloved and esteemed both in his own Church and in ours. In addition to his college duties and his editorial work, he was president of the Abbeville County Bible Society.

The new building of the Mulberry church, in Shelby county, Ky., was dedicated last Sunday. Mulberry is one of the oldest churches in this part of Kentucky, dating back, we think, to 1796; it has been the source of great blessing to the churches of Kentucky as a fruitful source of her ministry. Recently the Louisville and Nashville railroad extended its track east of Shelbyville in such a way as rendered the church building useless. Proper damages were paid, and with this and the contributions of the people a beautiful new church building, adorned with handsome windows, comfortable pews, elegant carpet and excellent lights, has been erected. The services of the occasion were conducted by Rev. J. B. Andrew, the sermon was by Rev. T. E. Converse, and the prayer of dedication was by the pastor, Rev. J. B.

direct. He confined himself strictly to the word of God, and brought his message from the Bible. He believed thoroughly in keeping himself free from the entanglements of politics, and tried to build up character. His heart was full of sympathy, and he was beloved as a pastor.

His ministry was blessed with frequent revivals of religion, and the churches under his care were built up in the faith.

His brethren in the Presbytery all loved him, and they will miss him sorely as a wise counsellor, a genial companion, and a true friend.

May God bless and keep the sorrowing family, and raise up others to carry on his work in the ministry.

In his short stay with us his course was commendable, his devotion untiring, his life pure and unassailable.
