PARKE FUNERAL**

Retired Army Colonel, Well Known in Northwest, Dies in His Portland Home.

Funeral arrangements for Colonel John S. Parke, who died Friday at his home, No. 811 Johnson street, had not been completed late Saturday though possibilities of interment at West Point, N. Y., were being considered by members of the family.

Colonel Parke, who had served in the Northwest during the early years of his military career, came to Portland to reside, following his retirement from the regular army in 1915. He was born in Tennessee 73 years ago and was appointed to the military academy from that state.

Following graduation in 1879 he served at Fort Klamath and at Vancouver barracks. While at Vancouver barracks he set out the row of trees now in front of the officers' quarters. His subsequent service was in the Midwest, where he took part in the late Indian wars, in Cuba during the Spanish-American war, and in the Philippines in the insurrection. He served as military attaché at Brussels for three years.

In addition to his military service Colonel Parke studied law at the University of Washington and Lee. He was a member of the Oregon bar and engaged in intermittent practice. He was a member of the Arlington Club.

He was married to Miss Netta B. Brooke in 1886. Miss Brooke was a member of a prominent Portland family. He is survived by his wife and two daughters, Mrs. F. E. Prochnow of Jackson, Mont., and Mrs. Stephen K. Sophie Downs, A. E. Murphy, W. N. Ferrin, Esther Newquist, Berlin, Conn.


COL. J. S. PARK, U. S. ARMY, DEAD

Franklin Native Fought Indians; Spent 37 Years in Service.

Franklin, Tenn., Aug. 22—Col. John S. Park, 74, U. S. Army retired, native of Franklin, died Friday at his home in Portland, Oregon, according to word received by his niece, Mrs. A. H. Ewing of Franklin.

Col. Park was the last surviving member of the family of the late Dr. John S. Park, who died in 1907. He received his early education in McNutt school, Franklin, and entered West Point Military Academy graduating in 1879. He was married to Miss Henrietta Beall Brooke, daughter of a pioneer Oregon family. He was an officer of the 21st infantry until 1903, and was then transferred to the 14th infantry in which he rose to colonel April 4,



1915. He was retired on Sept. 20, 1915.

His first service was in the Washington and Oregon territory, during which he wrote a history of the Modoc war of 1873, and erected a monument to the memory of General Canby, killed April 11, 1873. He was then transferred to Nebraska, where he studied law in his spare time and was admitted to state practice. He became professor of military science at Virginia Military Academy and continued to study law in Washington and Lee university.

He took part in the winter campaign of 1890-1901 against the Sioux Indians, and in South Dakota, and laid out Fort DuChesne, Utah. He assisted in suppressing a threatened uprising among the Cheyenne Indians, and in the Spanish American war was present at the battle of Santiago. He was on duty in the Philippines three different times, fighting there three years. He visited China and Japan, and returned to Europe by way of India and Europe, to take command at Fort Missoula. His last assignment was military attache at the American embassy at Brussels, Belgium.

Col. Park was commissioned by the Manila Carnival Association to bear an invitation to the carnival to the King of Siam, who received him in private audience. The distinction of a private audience had only been given four other Americans at that time.

His last duty was on the Texas border at the opening of the war in Europe.

He is survived by his widow and two daughters, Mrs. Stephen Kellogg Plume of Waterberry, Conn., and Mrs. Ferdinand E. Prochnow of Dillon, Mont., and one grandson, Stephen V. Plume of Connecticut and the following nieces and nephews: Mrs. A. H. Ewing of Franklin, Mrs. Faily Price of Tampa, Fla., John Wallis of Chicago and Duval Wallis of New York city.
