 Patrick 2, Rev. John Vance 1) first of the name in
 Ireland whose will filed 1662 in the records of
 Dublin Castle, traces to the sons of James
 of Bown Casock, and who was a great-grandson of Sir
 Patrick Vance & Margaret Kennedy, his wife, great-
 daughter of King Robert II of Scotland.
 First ancestor in America was Dr. Patrick Vance
 graduated of University of Edinburgh, appointed
 third Surgeon in Christian's Campaign at Camp
 Lady Ann in Oct. 1776, his wife Catherine, b. 1763.
 He and his two brothers Maj. William & John settled
 in Augusta County, Va. in 1742, and were engaged in
 the Indian Wars of 1764 & 1765.
