I started To Vandalia, accompanied by my  
Henry via South Eastern R.R 29 of Dec, but as there  
were no through trains leaving Nashville till next  
morning, we stayed all night at Cousin Silas; and  
after early breakfast - Friday 30<sup>th</sup> - we went over to Knoxville  
depot and took train, arrived at Vandalia Saturday  
New Years eve at  $\frac{1}{2}$  past 11 o'clock A.M. - I had a  
splendid time with the good people of Vandalia  
saw Henry snugly fixed at school under Praff's  
Care & Chilcote - I left for Home on Tuesday  
alone - 31 Jan' 1888 arrived safely via Knoxville Wednesday  
night at  $\frac{1}{2}$  9 - Miss Hill - Julia Ernst - Carrie McKenzie  
Maggie & her ever Mrs Spencer - Henry Van, Sister & Doctor  
Engene came down from Delaware the same night meeting me  
at Liberville

My dear father died on Saturday October 16<sup>th</sup>  
at 15 minutes past 2 o'clock a.m. Doctor Shurber  
and Doctor George C. Crockett were here early in the  
evening. Dr. George remained all night - doing all that  
could be done to procure relief. Pa to the lady.

Sister was not here we telegraphed her but she could  
not possibly get here, so she did not see the change.

I am led to believe that as God willed to take him - we  
did not see him struggle or show any distressing signs  
of being which so many endure in death - but we  
saw him give up his spirit and weaker until he  
seemed to fall peacefully to sleep - and his face wore  
a quiet happy look as if he were just ready to spring  
pleasantly to some one. How much we can bear  
we must know till it is put upon us. I shall never  
feel reconciled to his death - it seems a fresh  
sorrow every day.

My dear mother died in Louisville, Ky. Nov. 1<sup>st</sup>  
1865. She died on Saturday night, at Rachel's home  
was brought to Nashville and buried in Mount Olivet  
cemetery - in what Pa. bought - note: Mt. Olivet  
note - Rachel Homely
