The records in the cases of Cole, Davis, Good, Glover and Lamb are respectfully returned to Maj. Gen. Hurlbut. Sentences extending to loss of life, require the confirmation of the General commanding the army to which the Brigade or Division commanded by the officer who ordered the Court belongs. The same law applies as to cases tried by Military Commissions, or to those tried by Courts Martial. The endorsement in the case of Wade Good was a clerical error and has been corrected.
