condemned U.S. horses at Gallatin
Genl he purchased and paid
for a Sorrel horse for only one dollar,
and the letter L.C. was branded above
the letter ~~L.C.~~ The purchase was
made on the 12th April 1864.
as appears by quarter master
Receipt - of that date filed with
the Return - Joseph Bondurant
attended said sale and purchased said
horse for his brother Edward
who advanced him the money
of \$4⁰⁰ for that purpose.
Since which time until last
Thursday or Friday was a milk
about the 14th June, said sorrel
horse was taken possession of
by ~~Sheriff Smith~~, an overseer
for the manager of Negro Log
Camp at Camp Sandy

in Sumner County. He took
said horse out of his wagon
and put sold, him he has
not turned him over to the
Government.
He would show that about the
1st of May Capt. Hodges
had his two mules and
wagons - The wagon broke
down and was left on
the road. The two mules
are not released but not
sounded - One of them he
discovered in a Government
wagon about 10 days since
in Nashville - The other
is still at Camp Sanders,
Capt. Hodges having the
charge of that camp.
Said mules belong to your
Pikewar Edward Bonder
want - He has taken
the oath of allegiance as
well as the surety oath
and absconded them.
He says that you would
give an order for
the delivery of said horse

Edmond Bondurant or of the
Government now by the said Mules
to order that proper vouchers
of their value be given them
The Horn of a gyle four by four
and he asks for an order
upon the Smith to deliver
to him the said said Horn
all of which is respectfully submitted
